Notice of Initiation of Sunset Review of Definitive Anti-Dumping Duties levied on Dumped Imports of Secondary Quality Tinplate into Pakistan Originating in and / or Exported From Belgium, France, <u>Germany, Netherlands and USA</u>

The National Tariff Commission (the "Commission") received an application for review under Section 58(3) of the Anti-Dumping Duties Ordinance, 2000 (the "Ordinance") on June 13, 2014 from M/s Siddiqsons Tin Plate Limited, Karachi (the "Applicant"), domestic producers of Secondary Quality Tinplate ("SQTP"). This application was made following the publication (published in national press and official Gazette on April 15, 2014) of a notice of impending expiry of definitive anti-dumping duties levied on dumped imports of SQTP into Pakistan originating in and/or exporting from Belgium, France, Germany, Netherlands and USA (the "Exporting Countries"). The Applicants have alleged that expiry of anti-dumping duties on SQTP would likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of dumping of SQTP from the Exporting Countries and injury to the domestic industry producing SQTP.

Product under Review

The product allegedly being dumped into Pakistan is Secondary Quality Tinplate (originating in and/or exported from the Exporting Countries and is classified under Pakistan Customs Tariff classification number. 7210.1210 the "investigated product"). Basic raw material used for the production of the investigated product is "Tin Mill Black Plate (TMBP)", which is a steel based product. It has a wide range of applications e.g. packaging of edible oils, foodstuff, paints, petroleum products etc.

Anti-dumping Duties in force

The Commission initiated an anti-dumping investigation against dumping of SQTP from the Exporting Countries into Pakistan on January 16, 2009. The Commission imposed definitive anti-dumping duties on all exporters/producers from Exporting Countries ranging from 11.78 to 39.99 percent *ad val* on dumped imports for a period of five years with effect from July 16, 2009.

Application/Basis for Review

The Applicant has alleged dumping of the investigated product into Pakistan by the exporters from the Exporting Countries. It is further alleged that the imports of investigated product in Pakistan has caused and is causing material injury to the domestic industry, mainly, by way of: Cash flow; Market Shares, Wages; Growth; Employment and Productivity.

Initiation of Review

The Commission hereby initiates a review pursuant to Section 58(3) of the Ordinance to determine whether the expiry of the anti-dumping duties imposed on imports of SQTP from Exporting Countries would likely to lead to continuation or recurrence of dumping and injury, or not.

Continuation of Anti-dumping Duties

In terms of Section 58(3) of the Ordinance, the anti-dumping duties imposed on dumped imports of SQTP from the Exporting Countries will remain in-force pending the outcome of the review.

Period for Review (POR)

The sunset review would be conducted on the basis of information for the last three years i.e. from Apr 11-Mar 12, Apr 12-Mar 13 and Apr 13-Mar 14.
